ISNZ Member School Statistics Report 2012

School Membership

ISNZ Member School membership stands at 44. Huanui College, Whangarei was granted membership in 2011.

Student Numbers

An *overall decrease in student numbers* of 1.15% has been largely driven by a 7.02% reduction in South Island students. Wellington numbers were also down 2.70% while Waikato/BOP had an increase of 4.44%.

In 2012, the total number of students enrolled in ISNZ Member Schools is 23,024 (2011 23,293 students).

Boys' schools (ie having over 75% boys making up the school roll) represent 27.27% (12 boys' schools) of the total number of ISNZ Member Schools.

Girls' schools (ie having over 75% of girls making up the school roll) represent 22.73% (10 girls' schools) of the total number of ISNZ Member Schools.

Co-educational schools make up 54.55% (24 co-educational schools) of the total number of schools.

NB: These figures exclude preschool students.

NB: A member school may be included in more than one category, eg boys' school and co-educational school.

The *number of boys* enrolled in ISNZ Member Schools has increased by 0.02% with boys making up 50.88% (2011 50.28%) of the total number of enrolments.

The *number of girls* enrolled in ISNZ Member Schools has decreased by 2.34% with girls making up 49.12% (2011 49.72%) of the total number of enrolments.

NB: These figures exclude preschool students.

Boarders

There are 20 ISNZ Member Schools with boarders, two of which have boarders making up the majority of the school roll.

There are a total of 3082 boarders in 2012, an increase of 1.68% from 2011. Boarders represent 13.39% (2011 13.01%) of the total number of students enrolled at ISNZ Member Schools.

In 2012 there are *2161 boys enrolled as boarders*, a 2.22% increase from 2011.

In 2012 there are *921 girls enrolled as boarders*, a 0.44% increase from 2011. From the total of 3082 boarders in 2012, *2556 are secondary school students* (82.93% of total boarders) and *526 are primary school students* (17.07% of total boarders).

Full Boarders vs Weekly Boarders

From the data provided there has been a decrease of 1.62% in the number of full boarders from 2,898 in 2011 to 2,851 in 2012.

Weekly Boarders have increased 73.68% from 133 in 2011 to 231 in 2012.

A weekly boarding option is now provided by 6 schools compared to 4 in 2011.

Secondary Schools

There are 26 ISNZ Member Schools with secondary school students.

Secondary students represent 59.50% of all students (excluding preschool students) enrolled at ISNZ Member Schools.

There are a total of 13,699 secondary students in 2012 giving a 0.31% decrease from 2011.

Primary Students (including Y7 and Y8 students)

There are 39 ISNZ Member Schools with primary schools (90.70% of ISNZ Member Schools offer primary education).

There are a total of 9325 primary students giving a 2.37% decrease of primary students enrolled in ISNZ Member Schools.

Primary school students represent 40.50% of all students (excluding preschool students) enrolled in ISNZ Member Schools.

Preschools

There are 13 schools with a preschool (14 in 2011). 30.23% of ISNZ Member Schools offer preschool education.

There are a total of 596 preschool students enrolled at ISNZ Member Schools, giving a 9.42% decrease from 2011.

Preschool students make up 2.52% of the total number of students enrolled in ISNZ Member Schools.

International Students

There are 28 ISNZ Member Schools with international students (32 in 2011).

There are a total of 577 international students (as at 1 March 2012) enrolled at ISNZ Member Schools, giving a 5.29% increase from 2011.

International students make up 2.51% of the total student population (excluding preschool students) in ISNZ Member Schools.

NB: The total number of international students in South Island schools has fallen by 43.75% over the year from March 2011.

Regional Student Numbers 2006 to 2012

Please find attached a summary of student numbers in ISNZ Member Schools for the past seven years analysed by Year groups and by region. These analyses show the following changes from 2011.

Auckland:	0.21% increase in total student numbers
Waikato/Bay of Plenty:	4.44% increase in total student numbers
Central North Island:	0.42% decrease in total student numbers
Wellington:	2.70% decrease in total student numbers
South Island:	7.02% decrease in total student numbers.
Total:	1.15% decrease in total student numbers.

NCEA and other School Qualifications

Of the 26 ISNZ Member Schools that submitted data in this category:

- x 6 schools offer only CIE (Cambridge International Examinations)
- x 5 schools offer only NCEA (National Certificate of Educational Achievement)
- x 9 schools offer NCEA and CIE
- x 7 schools offer IB (International Baccalaureate) and NCEA.

Student/Staff Ratio (excluding preschool staff)

The average staff/student ratio for 2012 is 11.44 students per teacher, compared to 11.47:1 students per teacher in 2011.

Grants/GST Analysis

Please find attached a summary of the GST paid on grants, tuition, boarding fees and additional foreign student tuition fees.

NB: GST for 2012 is shown at the 15% GST
ISNZ Member Schools for 2012 paid collectively \$14,666,468 more in GST than they received in government grants.
